

Item for Agenda of Dover Forum – KALC Oct 2024 from cllr Sarah Waite-Gleave of Walmer Parish Council (07931 975769)

To note: further to the advice from Kent Resilience Forum July 2024 on the need to update parish level resilience plans due to wider range of risks including risks of extreme weather events due to worsening climate change:

list of risks within the KRF template recommended 24/7/2024 (https://www.kentprepared.org.uk/)

feedback from DDC Climate and Nature forum (set up with a Dec 2023 meeting to which a handful of town council clerks were invited) suggestion, more local level 1 councils may want to ask to participate,

parish level and Dover district level carbon footprint information, available also to all 35 parish councils in Dover district, to all level councils nationwide.

The template to update parish level resilience plans is very helpful and easy to use. This is the list of events KRF suggests we level 1 councils should put into our updated plans.

Flooding (including coastal, river or surface or ground water) A warmer climate sucks up more moisture, leading to heavier and more unpredictable downpours)

Fire

High winds

Heavy snow & extreme cold (climate change is leading to reduction / loss of gulf stream as arctic meltwater flows south)

Heat wave / Drought (in July 2022 temperatures hit 39/40 degrees in UK, health advice was not to go out 11 – 3pm and fire services became very overstretched)

Electricity failure

Gas failure

Water supply failure

Pandemic (covid or other)

(suggest in Dover district we add road gridlock given the comments from David Parrott, DDC Resilience manager 24/7) Gridlock on A-roads (A2, A20, A258, A256, A257 other)

KALC Resilience Forum

Key takeaway messages:

- There are very likely to be intense dry hot drought periods once every 4 years.
- More intense rain periods (long periods in winter; sudden thundery ones in summer) sea level rise in 2100 like to range between 0.5 and 1.15m). Not unrealistic that melting arctic will cause loss of gulf stream.
- Public support for action. Expressed by 74% of respondents to 2021 census. KCC has bought 2 large solar farms in Somerset 22MW which represent 76% of electricity used by KCC (private note sw-g Update on ELES work July 2024 KCC cttee meeting agenda). Encouraging private residents to reduce their carbon footprint with Green Open Homes project
- Local councils need to develop a Climate Action Plan . some guidance on www.greatcollaboration.uk/the-toolkit but no template / exemplars
- Taking increased threats of wildfires seriously especially where parish boundaries are on edge of farmland. Need for firebreaks on edges of all new developments. UK wildfire peaks are April & July.
- Sw-g Q to CSE's Steve Cole about how to push LPA to reach and incentivize private landlords to make their rental properties energy efficient – got response we don't have answer but this is very important / key question. Less regulatory obstruction to retrofit on historic / conservation buildings see Historic England new 2024 Advice Note Saving Energy and Carbon.

- <u>Look after what you love litter launch!</u> We launched our new anti-litter campaign 'Look after what you love' at Climate Action Day. People will choose their favourite stencil design that will be used to help stop littering at 'hot-spots' in the town.
- Work has begun on the Ocean and Coastal Recovery Declaration & Strategy To make a declaration supporting the recovery
 of the Deal coastline and sea off Deal, to develop strategies to achieve this for the Town Council itself and to develop
 cooperative strategies with neighbours and interested parties
- Coming up in Spring 2025, to make Deal a **hedgehog friendly town** by raising awareness amongst residents and distributing hedgehog-friendly fence gravel boards to households and from the summer to recruit **Tree Guardians** and start the next phase of the **Hedge Pledge**


